



From the pastor...

April

When we look at the events of the final days that Jesus was on earth, we can glean some insights into the heart of our faith.

The Last Supper pictures a time of separation and fellowship. Jesus excused Judas to go his own way and to do what he had set out to do. Only then did Jesus open His heart to his disciples. He gave special significance to the bread and the cup that only His followers understood. Eating the bread signified He would be in them, nourishing them, sustaining them. Drinking the cup meant that His blood was shed for their sins, for their salvation. As we celebrate The Lord's Supper **we too are separated from the world unto Christ. We have special fellowship** with the One Who gave His body and blood for us.

The Garden of Gethsemane jars our sense of faithfulness. Jesus was in agony while the disciples were asleep. We can identify with them because many times we fail, even though we try to follow Christ. Christ didn't want to be separated from His Father. He didn't want to become sin with all its wickedness and shame. This battle was so fierce that his sweat became like great drops of blood and the angels had to strengthen Him. But He was obedient. He was also gracious toward his weak disciples. The Garden reminds us to be **obedient and faithful in prayer**, even though we fail at times.

The trials that Jesus faced were unjust. The time, the procedure, and the outcome were all illegal. The religious trials before Annas, before Caiaphas, and before the Sanhedrin were rigged. The civil trials before Pilate and Herod were not civil at all. Truth, though innocent, was mocked, beaten, reviled, scourged, and condemned to death as though He were guilty. The trials remind us that we may be called upon to **suffer unjustly for following Christ**.

The Cross was a place of death. It was where the criminal received justice. On the Cross, Jesus became the ultimate criminal, guilty of every crime and sin since the world began. Justice was done. The crimes were paid for. Now we are to take up our cross daily and follow Christ. To do that **we must die to self**.

The empty tomb is the point of victory. The body's final resting place isn't final now. One day we will have a new body a Heavenly body an incorruptible body an eternal body. There is life beyond the grave. When we identify ourselves with Christ's work on the Cross, we also identify with Him in His resurrection! **Because of the resurrection we have hope**. Our life is not meaningless. We have eternal life. We will celebrate victoriously with all our believing loved ones. We have no idea of all the wonderful things awaiting us.

These events remind us that we are separated from the world to have fellowship with Christ. We should understand the need to be obedient in spite of weaknesses. We can expect to experience injustice and suffering if we follow Christ. To live for Christ, we must die to self but have a clear vision of our future. **May we be steadfast, unmoveable, always abounding in the work of the Lord, knowing that our labor is not in vain in the Lord.**
