THE DISCIPLINE OF DELAY!

Someone once said, “God’s delays are not His denials.” I don’t like delays and have wrestled with the whys of delays in my life. You have too. Why does it take so long to get well? Why is it taking so long for me to get that job? Why doesn’t God answer my prayers? Scripture reveals that others have faced delays in their lives. And they didn’t like it either. But God was in the delays and He worked His will in His time.



Abraham was 75 when God first promised him descendants (Gen. 12:2-4). He repeated His promise several times (Gen. 12:7; 13:16; 15:5) and Abraham believed that God would do it (15:6). But it didn’t happen. Why the delay? They had waited 8 years! Abraham and Sarah worked out a way for it to happen, without delaying any longer. Hagar, Sarah’s handmade, had Ishmael by Abraham and so now Abraham had an heir. Abraham was 84 when Ishmael was born. When Abraham was 99 God revealed to Abraham that Ishmael was not the fulfillment of His promise, Isaac would be (Gen. 17:19). Abraham was 100 years old when the promised son was born. So, there was a delay of 25 years from the initial promise to its fulfillment. Abraham made some serious mistakes during the delay, just as we sometimes make mistakes when God makes us wait. Yet God was faithful to Abraham and to His promises. God’s delay was not His denial.

Joseph was 17 years old when he antagonized his brothers with his dreams (Gen. 37:2, 5-10). Those dreams indicated that he would one day rule over them. God arranged some tough circumstances to bring this about. In their hostility, the brothers captured him and sold him into slavery. Joseph wound up in Egypt, first being a servant to Potiphar, and then spending an extensive time in an Egyptian prison. But, “in the fulness of time” God raised Him up to rule over Egypt (Gen. 41) and, ultimately, over his family (Gen. 46). Since Joseph was 30 years old when he became the “Prime Minister” over Egypt, he experienced a delay of 13 years for the fulfillment of his dreams. Those years of delay were discouraging and rough for him. Sometimes our delays are discouraging and rough. But God’s delay was not His denial.

David was in his teens when he was anointed king over Israel by the prophet Samuel (1 Sam. 16:13). He did some mighty feats in killing Goliath and gaining victory over the Philistines. Yet, King Saul became extremely jealous of David and for years tried to kill him. David was at least 30 when he actually became king after Saul was killed in a battle with the Philistines. The leaders of the tribe of Judah anointed him king over the house of Judah (2 Sam. 2:4). Seven years later the leaders of the other tribes of Israel came to Hebron and David became the king over all Israel, just as the Lord had promised through Samuel. Those years of delay were years of danger and discouragement, grief and groaning, fleeing and fighting (Ps. 31:9-13). But they were also years of personal maturity and spiritual growth in David so that his trust in God deepened (Ps. 31:14-24). Because of the delay, David was a better king than he would have been. God will use our delays to make us better and to draw us closer to Him. God’s delay was not His denial.

Are you frustrated about a delay that you are enduring right now? Maybe God is speaking to you as He spoke to me one time, “You have need of patience that, after you have done the will of God, you shall receive the promise” (Hebrews 10:36). God’s delay in my life was not His denial.
